- **2020 MCFA work plan priorities**: The membership approved a <u>2020 work plan</u> for MCFA, which focuses the coalition's activities on:
 - Endangered Species Act (ESA) implementation;
 - the role of epidemiological studies in human health pesticide risk assessments;
 - use of real-world monitoring data in conducting drinking water assessments, and refining models accordingly;
 - evaluating pesticide exposure impacts on pollinators;
 - harmonizing Maximum Residue Limits (MRLs) globally;
 - IR-4 and U.S. Department of Agriculture Office of Pest Management Policy funding;
 - use of antibiotics and other antimicrobial products in horticulture; and
 - supporting continued pesticide-use surveys to inform the agencies' decision making.
